DETECTIVES SEEKING INFORMATION IN REFERENCE TO TWO MISSING PUPPIES

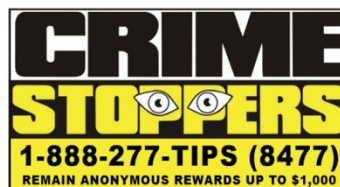

District detectives with the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office are seeking information into two recent missing puppies. The first occurred in the 300 block of Bronson Pkwy., off I.G.P. on the morning of 07 November. The 36-year old homeowner told deputies at the time that he let his three-month old Rottweiler out for a walk around 9:30 a.m. When the dog hadn't returned by 10:15 a.m., he went out looking for him. The puppy, who is named "Maui", was not wearing a collar.

The second missing puppy occurred during the day on 11 November at a residence in the 4,800 block of Vogel Rd., off Pacetti Rd. The 33-year old female victim stated that she had placed multiple dogs inside their gated dog run during the day. When the family returned that afternoon, the gate to the run was standing open and all of the dogs were loose. The family located all of the dogs except for a 15 week old Victorian Bulldog. The missing puppy, valued at \$2,500, was brown and white with a black eye patch. He weighs 35 pounds, answers to the name of "Moose" and was not wearing a collar.
