# SAFETY FOR SENIORS

### FINANCIAL SAFETY AND SECURITY:

When dealing with financial matters such as banking, taxes, investments, social security, and retirement, only use secure networks, websites, applications, and verified corporate phone numbers.

- ▶ Do not reply to received emails or calls asking you to verify login, password or other account information.
- ▶ Do not call the phone numbers provided within emails asking you to call and verify account or payment info.
- ▶ Do not send money cards to any "government agency" asking for money cards as payment.
- Beware of any phone call or email saying you need to pay to avoid being arrested for warrants, fines or fees.
- Beware of any calls asking for money for family members due to arrest, warrants, property damage or kidnapping.
- Beware of any emails or calls asking for your information to claim prize money for a game/lottery that you did not play.
- Do not deposit checks in your account if you do not know where they came from or what they are for.
- Shred all financial paperwork and credit card applications before throwing them away.

#### AT HOME SAFETY:

ocks, lighting, and landscaping are the hallmarks of home security. Limit access to your house, secure your valuables, and keep emergency communication on you in case of a break-in or medical emergency.

- Keep doors locked Entry, Sliding, and Garage.
- Keep windows locked or blocked.
- Keep landscaping trimmed short around doors and windows.
- Leave exterior lights on at night to discourage loitering and prowling.
- Keep your cell phone charged and with you in case of an emergency.
- Use your house alarm or a door chime to alert you to open windows and doors.

- Keep smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms working.
- Secure your valuables Hide/Mounted Lockbox/ Safe or Safe Deposit Box.
- Secure and keep track of medications — Sometimes they can be a bigger target than your valuables.
- Use only reputable, bonded, and insured contractors with personal references.
- Put information for emergency contacts on the refrigerator.

#### **SAFETY OUT IN PUBLIC:**

To be safe out in public, increase your awareness, limit the time you are by yourself, and secure your valuables.

- Lock your car doors as soon as you are inside your car.
- Park in well-lit areas after dark, as close to an entrance as possible.
- Walk with other people to/from the parking lot when possible.
- Do not leave valuables in your car. If you have to, hide them out of view.
- Always keep your purse closed up and near you.

- Do not leave your purse unattended in a cart.
- Allow a store employee to walk back out to your car with you and help with bags.
- Use cards and carry less cash. DO NOT display large amounts of cash out in public, if possible.
- Leave a note or tell someone where you are going and update them on your schedule.
